



Bloemfontein Primary School: Sports Premium Funding 2020-21

The allocation for Bloemfontein this year is £17,610

The Department for Education's vision for the Primary PE and Sports Premium is that ALL pupils leaving primary school should be physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

The seven Government priorities for use of the Sports Premium Funding are as follows:

1. Achieving high quality P.E
2. Increasing participation and inclusion
3. Promoting healthy, active lifestyles
4. Providing competitive school sport
5. Developing leadership, the curriculum and subject profile
6. Contributing to pupils' overall achievement
7. Developing partnerships

As a school we have identified a significant lack of physical activity during lockdown and are passionate about daily exercise to promote physical health and improved emotional wellbeing.
