



## **Bloemfontein Primary School: Sports Premium Funding 2022-23**

### **The allocation for Bloemfontein this year is £17,600**

**The Department for Education's vision for the Primary PE and Sports Premium is that ALL pupils leaving primary school should be physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.**

**The seven Government priorities for use of the Sports Premium Funding are as follows:**

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity per day, of which 30 minutes should be in school.
2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increased participation in competitive sport

Below, is a breakdown of how the funding in 2022/23 has been allocated and the desired impact of this funding.
