



Bloemfontein Primary School: Sports Premium Funding 2021-22

The allocation for Bloemfontein this year is £17,470

The Department for Education's vision for the Primary PE and Sports Premium is that ALL pupils leaving primary school should be physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

The seven Government priorities for use of the Sports Premium Funding are as follows:

1. Achieving high quality P.E
2. Increasing participation and inclusion
3. Promoting healthy, active lifestyles
4. Providing competitive school sport
5. Developing leadership, the curriculum and subject profile
6. Contributing to pupils' overall achievement
7. Developing partnerships

As a school we have identified a significant lack of physical activity during both COVID lockdown periods and are passionate about daily exercise to promote physical health and improved emotional wellbeing.

Below, is a breakdown of how the funding in 2021/22 has been allocated and the desired impact of this funding.
