This still enabled increased interest in a wider range of sports. Non-competitive football games were played to enable team games
Equipment – Due to social distancing requirements during P.E lessons (COVID) and a focus on athletics to promote high levels of physical activity (identified as lacking during COVID) it is necessary to purchase additional equipment. Playtimes and lunchtimes are also operating in bubbles and equipment cannot be shared resulting in a need for more physical play equipment.	LL KG Lunchtime staff	£500	Pupils are increasingly more actively involved in playtime activities. Further resources will need to be purchased next academic year. The daily mile takes place from Year 1 upwards which helps promote healthy lifestyles and physical activity. Pupils in Reception class also access outdoors on a daily basis. Play leaders trained and helped deliver activities during playtimes. Next step to provide further training for lunchtime supervisors in order to promote play activities.

School were creative with this and purchased tents and a range of camping equipment. This enabled all pupils from Year 3 upwards to attend an 'in bubble' camping experience. This also included forest school activities.
